Built in 1861 by Oblate missionary, Father Albert Lacombe, the Chapel became the centre of one of Alberta's oldest communities, St. Albert. Today the chapel has been restored to look much as it did when it was built.

Role

We are looking for an enthusiastic individual with at least two years' post-secondary education, a passion for learning, good leadership and organizational skills, and experience in historical interpretation.

As Lead Historical Interpreter you will provide leadership and participate fully in a small workplace team responsible for the planning, development and presentation of school programs, special events, off-site public interpretive programs and interpretive tours. You will work under the supervision of the Program Coordinator taking direction for the team, and providing reports in a timely manner.

A successful candidate for this position will converse both in English and French, confidently to audiences of various sizes with a variety of ages and be able to assimilate large amounts of information quickly. Intensive training is provided May 1 to May 14, 2019.

The duties of all site staff will include the collection of admission fees and visitor statistics, administering site surveys, events promotion and marketing, day-to-day administration, and maintaining the general cleanliness and order of visitor facilities. This position requires weekend work. Walking and standing for extended periods, as well as lifting and carrying moderate loads are part of this job. It is a historically costumed position with costumes provided.
